



In a world of never-ending tourbillons, Jean Dunand's Tourbillon Orbital stands apart as one of the most originally conceived of these high complications. Why? The difference is the Tourbillon Orbital's flying tourbillon that not only rotates once every minute on its own axis, but also performs an ethereal transmigration around the watch dial once every hour. \* Since the year of its inception, Jean Dunand's owner, Thierry Oulevay, has increasingly used the watch's vast dial expanse as a canvas for high watchmaking arts, including miniature painting, hand guilloché, grande feu enamel and mosaic. The richness of expression on the dial combined with its perennial revolutions result in a timepiece that is hauntingly unforgettable and totally customizable.
